The 1790 **Wicks House** displays furniture, fine art, toys and textiles through which we see how the townspeople lived over the centuries. One special exhibit depicts the art of pre-Civil War medicine practiced by Dr. Wicks. (Be happy you live today!)

The Visitors' Center and ticket office is located in the replica Hallett Barn, a welcoming place with revolving exhibits on Falmouth's past as well as the

The Museums on the Green (MOG), a treasure trove of artifacts and information, tells the story of our town. The 1795 Wicks House displays the 18th century home of Dr. Francis Wicks, an early adopter of small pox vaccination. The 1730 Conant House exhibit explores the timeline of Falmouth History. The replica Hallett Barn and attached Cultural Center show revolving exhibits from our unique collections, as well as a lovely space for our year round lecture series and private rentals.

MOG strives to be an interesting destination for residents and visitors. We believe that the more people know about the rich heritage that surrounds us, the more they will see themselves as a part of Falmouth's continuing story.
